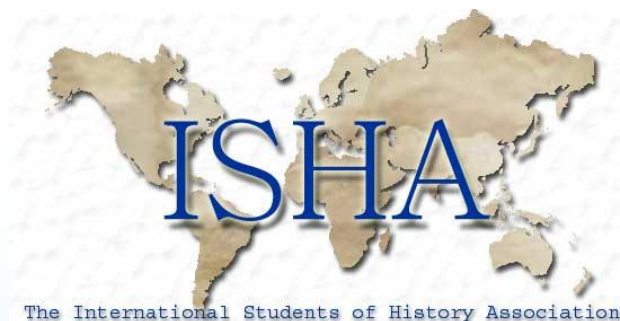

The **I**nternational **S**tudents of **H**istory **A**ssociation (**ISHA**) was founded in Hungary in 1989 as an international, academic, non-profit, independent network. Right from the start ISHA enabled students and recent graduates interested in history and related sciences from both sides of the former Iron Curtain to come together and exchange their views and experiences.



ISHA is about getting into contact with other history students from all over Europe, participating in as well as organising seminars, workshops – and of course sharing a great time together. In this way, ISHA's members actively practise an international understanding of history, both by learning about regional specifics and by challenging traditional views within simple national frameworks.

This is best accomplished during the various seminars and the Annual Conference that ISHA holds each year. Seminars and conferences usually last for one week and are organised by different local sections, while they cover a wide range of topics related to history. At every Annual Conference in spring a new International Board (IB) and Council are elected from all ISHA members. The IB organises and administrates the association and is supported by the Council.

Taking part in ISHA means to participate in seminars and conferences organised by students for students. You will be able to present papers to an international group and discuss your specific topics of interest as well as those of others. Last, but not least, you'll have the chance to visit new places, learn about different cultures and traditions.
